
# 1.1 Before you proceed

Take note of the following precautions before you install motherboard components or change any motherboard settings.



- Unplug the power cord from the wall socket before touching any component.
- Before handling components, use a grounded wrist strap or touch a safely grounded object or a metal object, such as the power supply case, to avoid damaging them due to static electricity.
- Before you install or remove any component, ensure that the ATX power supply is switched off or the power cord is detached from the power supply. Failure to do so may cause severe damage to the motherboard, peripherals, or components.

# 1.2 Motherboard overview





Unplug the power cord before installing or removing the motherboard. Failure to do so can cause you physical injury and damage motherboard components.

# 1. CPU and chassis fan connectors (4-pin CPU\_FAN, 4-pin CHA\_FAN)


Connect the fan cables to the fan connectors on the motherboard, ensuring that the black wire of each cable matches the ground pin of the connector.

### 2. ATX power connectors (24-pin EATXPWR, 8-pin EATX12V)

These connectors are for ATX power supply plugs. The power supply plugs are designed to fit these connectors in only one orientation. Find the proper orientation and push down firmly until the connectors completely fit.




- We recommend that you use an EATX 12V Specification 2.0-compliant power supply unit (PSU) with a minimum of 300W power rating. This PSU type has 24-pin and 8-pin power plugs.
- DO NOT forget to connect the 4-pin/8-pin ATX +12V power plug.
   Otherwise, the system will not boot up.
- We recommend that you use a PSU with higher power output when configuring a system with more power-consuming devices or when you intend to install additional devices. The system may become unstable or may not boot up if the power is inadequate.
- If you are uncertain about the minimum power supply requirement for your system, refer to the Recommended Power Supply Wattage Calculator at <a href="http://support.asus.com/PowerSupplyCalculator/PSCalculator.aspx?SLanguage=en-us">http://support.asus.com/PowerSupplyCalculator/PSCalculator.aspx?SLanguage=en-us</a> for details.





Do not forget to connect the fan cables to the fan connectors. Insufficient air flow inside the system may damage the motherboard components. These are not jumpers! Do not place jumper caps on the fan connectors! The CPU\_FAN connector supports a CPU fan of maximum 1A (12 W) fan power.




# 3. FAN RGB header (4-pin FAN\_RGB\_HEADER)

This header is for RGB LED strips of a CPU fan



The FAN RGB header supports CPU fans with multi-color LED strips (12V/G/R/B) and with a maximum power rating of 1A (12V).





Before you install or remove any component, ensure that the ATX power supply is switched off or the power cord is detached from the power supply. Failure to do so may cause severe damage to the motherboard, peripherals, or components.

### 4. AMD AM4 CPU socket

This motherboard comes with a AMD AM4 socket designed for AMD Ryzen™ / 7th Generation A-series / Athlon™ processors.



For more details, refer to Central Processing Unit (CPU).

### 5. DDR4 DIMM slots

Install 2 GB, 4 GB, 8 GB, and 16 GB unbuffered ECC and non-ECC DDR4 DIMMs into these DIMM sockets.



For more details, refer to System memory.

### AMD B350 SATA 6.0Gb/s ports (7-pin SATA6G 1~6)

These ports connect to SATA 6.0 Gb/s hard disk drives via SATA 6.0 Gb/s signal cables.



# 7. Clear RTC RAM (2-pin CLRTC)

This header allows you to clear the Real Time Clock (RTC) RAM in CMOS. You can clear the CMOS memory of date, and system setup parameters by erasing the CMOS RTC RAM data. The onboard button cell battery powers the RAM data in CMOS, which include system setup information such as system passwords.

### To erase the RTC RAM:

- 1. Turn OFF the computer and unplug the power cord.
- 2. Use a metal object such as a screwdriver to short the two pins.
- 3. Plug the power cord and turn ON the computer.
- Hold down the < Del> key during the boot process and enter BIOS setup to re-enter data.





If the steps above do not help, remove the onboard battery and short the two pins again to clear the CMOS RTC RAM data. After clearing the CMOS, reinstall the battery.

### 8. System panel connector (10-15 pin PANEL)

This connector supports several chassis-mounted functions.

## System power LED (2-pin PWR\_LED)

This 2-pin connector is for the system power LED. Connect the chassis power LED cable to this connector. The system power LED lights up when you turn on the system power, and blinks when the system is in sleep mode.

# Hard disk drive activity LED (2-pin HDD\_LED)

This 2-pin connector is for the HDD Activity LED. Connect the HDD Activity LED cable to this connector. The HDD LED lights up or flashes when data is read from or written to the HDD.

### ATX power button/soft-off button (2-pin PWR BTN)


This connector is for the system power button.

### Reset button (2-pin RESET)

This 2-pin connector is for the chassis-mounted reset button for system reboot without turning off the system power.

# 9. Speaker connector (4-pin SPEAKER)

The 4-pin connector is for the chassis-mounted system warning speaker. The speaker allows you hear system beeps and warnings.






### 10. USB 2.0 connectors (10-1 pin USB3~6)

These connectors are for USB 2.0 ports. Connect the USB module cable to any of these connector, then install the module to a slot opening at the back of the system chassis. These USB connectors comply with USB 2.0 specifications and supports up to 480Mbps connection speed.




Never connect a 1394 cable to the USB connectors. Doing so will damage the motherboard!



# 11. USB 3.1 Gen 1 connector (20-1 pin U31G1\_12)

This connector allows you to connect a USB 3.1 Gen 1 module for additional USB 3.1 Gen 1 front or rear panel ports. With an installed USB 3.1 Gen 1 module, you can enjoy all the benefits of USB 3.1 Gen 1 including faster data transfer speeds of up to 5Gbps, faster charging time for USB-chargeable devices, optimized power efficiency and backward compatibility with USB 2.0.




# 12. Serial port connector (10-1 pin COM)

This connector is for a serial (COM) port. Connect the serial port module cable to this connector, then install the module to a slot opening at the back of the system chassis.



### 13. Front panel audio connector (10-1 pin AAFP)

This connector is for a chassis-mounted front panel audio I/O module that supports either HD Audio or legacy AC'97 audio standard. Connect one end of the front panel audio I/O module cable to this connector.





- We recommend that you connect a high-definition front panel audio module to this
  connector to avail of the motherboard's high-definition audio capability.
- If you want to connect a high-definition front panel audio module to this connector, set the Front Panel Type item in the BIOS setup to [HD]. If you want to connect an AC'97 front panel audio module to this connector, set the item to [AC97]. By default, this connector is set to [HD].

# 14. Digital audio connector (4-1 pin SPDIF\_OUT)

This connector is for an additional Sony/Philips Digital Interface (S/PDIF) port. Connect the S/PDIF Out module cable to this connector, then install the module to a slot opening at the back of the system chassis.



# 15. PCI Express x16 slots

This motherboard supports two PCI Express x16 graphic cards that comply with the PCI Express specifications.

- In single VGA card mode, use the PCle 3.0/2.0 x16\_1 slot (gray) for a PCl Express x16 graphics card to get better performance.
- We recommend that you provide sufficient power when running CrossFireX<sup>™</sup> mode.
- Connect a chassis fan to the motherboard connector labeled CHA\_FAN1/2 when using multiple graphics cards for better thermal environment.

### 16. PCI Express 2.0 x1 slot


This motherboard has one PCI Express 2.0 x1 slot that supports PCI Express x1 network card, SCSI card, and other card that complies with the PCI Express specifications.

### 17. M.2 socket 3


These sockets allow you to install M.2 (NGFF) SSD modules.



- This socket supports M Key and 2242/2260/2280 storage devices
- Due to CPU limitation, M.2 socket supported varies by processor. Refer to the specifications summary table for more details.



# 1.2.2 Rear panel connectors




 USB 3.1 Gen 1 ports. These two 9-pin Universal Serial Bus (USB) ports connect to USB 3.1 Gen 1 devices



- USB 3.1 Gen 1 devices can only be used for data storage.
- Due to the design of the AMD AM4 series chipset, all USB devices connected to the USB2.0 and USB3.1 Gen 1 ports are controlled by the xHCl controller.
- Video Graphics Adapter (VGA) port. This 15-pin port is for a VGA monitor or other VGA-compatible devices.
- 3. PS/2 mouse/keyboard combo port. This port is for a PS/2 mouse/keyboard.

# 2.1 Managing and updating your BIOS



Save a copy of the original motherboard BIOS file to a USB flash disk in case you need to restore the BIOS in the future. Copy the original motherboard BIOS using the ASUS Update utility.

# 2.1.1 EZ Update

EZ Update is a utility that allows you to automatically update your motherboard's softwares, drivers and the BIOS version easily. With this utility, you can also manually update the saved BIOS and select a boot logo when the system goes into POST.

To launch EZ Update, click EZ Update on the Al Suite 3 main menu bar.





EZ Update requires an Internet connection either through a network or an ISP (Internet Service Provider).

### 2.1.2 ASUS EZ Flash 3

The ASUS EZ Flash 3 feature allows you to update the BIOS without using an OS-based utility.



- Ensure that you load the BIOS default settings to ensure system compatibility and stability. Select the Load Optimized Defaults item under the Exit menu.
- Check your Internet connection before updating the BIOS via the Internet.



### To update the BIOS using EZ Flash 3:

- Enter the Advanced Mode of the BIOS setup program. Go to the Tool menu to select ASUS EZ Flash 3 Utility and press <Enter> to enable it.
- 2. Follow the steps below to update the BIOS via a storage device or Internet.

### Via Storage Device

- Insert the USB flash disk that contains the latest BIOS file to the USB port, then select via Storage Device.
- b) Press <Tab> to switch to the **Drive** field.

# 2.1.3 ASUS CrashFree BIOS 3 utility

The ASUS CrashFree BIOS 3 is an auto recovery tool that allows you to restore the BIOS file when it fails or gets corrupted during the updating process. You can restore a corrupted BIOS file using the motherboard support DVD or a USB flash drive that contains the updated BIOS file



- Before using this utility, rename the BIOS file in the removable device into TB350MPG.CAP.
- The BIOS file in the support DVD may not be the latest version. Download the latest BIOS file from the ASUS website at www.asus.com.

# **Recovering the BIOS**

### To recover the BIOS:

- 1. Turn on the system.
- Insert the support DVD to the optical drive or the USB flash drive that contains the BIOS file to the USB port.
- The utility automatically checks the devices for the BIOS file. When found, the utility reads the BIOS file and enters ASUS EZ Flash 3 utility automatically.



- After the BIOS Updater checks the selected BIOS file, select Yes to confirm the BIOS update.

- Select Yes then press <Enter>. When BIOS update is done, press <ESC> to exit BIOS Updater.
- Restart your computer.

Ensure to load the BIOS default settings to ensure system compatibility and stability. Select the **Load Optimized Defaults** item under the **Exit** BIOS menu.

# 2.2 BIOS setup program

Use the BIOS Setup program to update the BIOS or configure its parameters. The BIOS screens include navigation keys and brief online help to guide you in using the BIOS Setup program.

# **Entering BIOS Setup at startup**

### To enter BIOS Setup at startup:

Press < Delete> or <F2> during the Power-On Self Test (POST). If you do not press
 Delete> or <F2>. POST continues with its routines.

### **Entering BIOS Setup after POST**

### To enter BIOS Setup after POST:

- Press < Ctrl>+ < Alt>+ < Del> simultaneously.
- Press the reset button on the system chassis.
- Press the power button to turn the system off then back on. Do this option only if you
  failed to enter BIOS Setup using the first two options.



Using the power button, reset button, or the **<Ctrl>+<Alt>+<Del>** keys to force reset from a running operating system can cause damage to your data or system. We recommend you always shut down the system properly from the operating system.





### Submenu items

A greater than sign (>) before each item on any menu screen means that the item has a submenu. To display the submenu, select the item and press <Enter>.

# Language

This button above the menu bar contains the languages that you can select for your BIOS. Click this button to select the language that you want to display in your BIOS screen.

### MyFavorites (F3)

This button above the menu bar shows all BIOS items in a Tree Map setup. Select frequently-used BIOS settings and save it to MyFavorites menu.

### Q-Fan Control (F6)

This button above the menu bar displays the current settings of your fans. Use this button to manually tweak the fans to your desired settings.

### Hot kevs

This button above the menu bar contains the navigation keys for the BIOS setup program. Use the navigation keys to select items in the menu and change the settings.

### Scroll bar

A scroll bar appears on the right side of a menu screen when there are items that do not fit on the screen. Press the Up/Down arrow keys or <Page Up> / <Page Down> keys to display the other items on the screen.

# General help

At the bottom left corner of the menu screen is a brief description of the selected item. Use <F12> key to capture the BIOS screen and save it to the removable storage device.

# **Configuration fields**

These fields show the values for the menu items. If an item is user-configurable, you can change the value of the field opposite the item. You cannot select an item that is not user-configurable.

A configurable field is highlighted when selected. To change the value of a field, select it and press <Enter> to display a list of options.

### Last Modified button

This button shows the items that you last modified and saved in BIOS Setup.


