


Removing the bottom cover

NOTE: The appearance of your Notebook PC's bottom view may vary per model.

- A. Remove the screw(s) from the Notebook PC's bottom cover.
- B. Loosen the pop-open screw(s).




- C. Place your Notebook PC in the orientation as shown in the illustration below.
- D. Starting from the bottom edge, pry loose the bottom cover.



E. In the orientation shown, use the plastic blade to pry open the indicated area of the bottom cover as shown in the illustration below.


IMPORTANT! Avoid sliding the plastic blade along the side of your Notebook PC to prevent damage.

F. Remove the bottom cover.




To reattach the bottom cover:

A. Align and reattach the bottom cover.



- B. Secure the bottom cover using the screw(s) you removed earlier.
- C. Tighten the pop-open screw(s).




Disconnecting the battery


A. Remove the bottom cover.










To install the new LCD panel module:



























